# **New Porgera Limited History**

New Porgera Limited was incorporated on 22 September 2022. It is owned by Kumul Minerals, with 36%, Mineral Resources Enga Limited (equally owned by Enga Provincial Government and Special Mining Lease Landowners) with 5%, Porgera Jersey Limited with 49% (equally owned by Barrick and Zijin), with Mineral Resources Development Company holding 10% of the equity in trust for Porgera Project landowners and Enga Provincial Government. It is an incorporated joint venture.

Special Mining Lease 13 (SML 13) was granted to New Porgera Limited on 13 October 2023. A Mining Lease, Pangalita Limestone Quarry, 9 Leases for Mining Purposes and 4 Mining Easements which are ancillary tenements to SML 13 were also granted to NPL.

The Porgera Mine restarted mining operations on 23 December 2023, and first gold was poured in January 2024.

#### (2) General Compensation

These costs represent broad based compensation payments for damage to bush, gardens & bridges etc. 2001 includes Anawe North LMP

#### (3) Community Assests and Relocation

These costs represent relocation and transfer of misc. assets, roads, buildings, etc., to the community 2001 includes Anawe North LMP, relocation of 90 houses

#### (4) Environmental Compensation Kaiya River and Porgera-Lagaip Rivers

These costs include a one off payment for loss of alluvial gold and an ongoing payment for the disposal of sediment and tailings at a determined rate once per calender year.

#### (5) Donations

Donations are made for Health Facilities, Schools (Community and High schools), Medivacs, Sporting Clubs and Youth Groups and SP Games. These donations are made to areas such as the Porgera District, Enga Province, Tari District, Strickland/Lake Murray and PNG generally.

# **Porgera Joint Venture History**

Special Mining Lease 1P was granted to the Porgera Joint Venture (PJV) in May 1989. At the time of the grant of the Special Mining Lease (SML) the ownership, under an unincorporated joint venture, of PJV was:

Placer (PNG) Ltd 30% Highlands Gold Properties Pty Limited 30% RGC (PNG) Holdings Pty Limited 30% Mineral Resources Porgera\* 10%

\*PNG Government 5%, Enga Provincial Government 2.5%, and SML landowners 2.5%

Prior to the grant of the SML discussions and negotiations were undertaken between the National Government, Enga Provincial Government (EPG) and Porgera Landowners regarding the proposed mine development. This was first such consultation for the development of a mine in PNG. It eventually led to consensus on the distribution of benefits and responsibilities amongst the parties which were recorded in a set of three Porgera Memorandums of Agreement. This process of consensus was referred to as the "Development Forum" and was later incorporated into the Mining Act 1992.

In 1996 the Government of PNG purchased an additional 15% (5% from each of the non-State Joint Venturers) in the mine making the ownership of PJV, Placer PNG, Highlands Gold Properties, RGC (PNG), 25% each, PNG Government 20% and Mineral Resources Enga 5% (shared equally by EPG and SML Landowners).

In March 2006, Barrick completed the takeover of Placer Dome Inc giving it 75% equity in the Porgera mine. In April 2007, Barrick purchased from Emperor Mines its 20% equity in the Porgera Project increasing Barrick's equity-holding in the Porgera Project to a total of 95%.

In May 2015 Barrick sold 50% of Barrick (Niugini) Limited (the holder of Barrick's equity in the Porgera mine) to Zijin Mining Group of China. This gave Barrick and Zijin an equal indirect equity holding of 47.5% of the Porgera mine, with Mineral Resources Enga Limited (equally owned by EPG and SML Landowners) holding the remaining 5%.

In April 2020, the PNG Government refused the extension application for Porgera SML1P and the mine was placed in care and maintenance from that time until December 2023.
